<b>Magna Carta (1215)</b>	<b>English Bill of Rights (1689)</b>	<b>The Declaration of Independence (1776)</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Barons (noblemen) may elect representatives who must follow the law just like everyone else</li> <li>• No scutage or aid (i.e.tax) shall be levied except by common counsel (consent)</li> <li>• No bailiff shall put anyone on trial by his own unsupported allegation, without bringing credible witnesses to the charge.</li> <li>• To no one shall we sell, delay or deny right or justice.</li> <li>• No free man shall be taken or imprisoned except by the lawful judgment of his peers or by the law of the land.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• That the pretended power of suspending the laws or the execution of laws by regal authority without consent of Parliament is illegal;</li> <li>• That it is the right of the subjects to petition the king, and all commitments and prosecutions for such petitioning are illegal;</li> <li>• That the raising or keeping a standing army within the kingdom in time of peace, unless it be with consent of Parliament, is against law;</li> <li>• That levying money for or to the use of the Crown by pretense of prerogative, without grant of Parliament, for longer time, or in other manner than the same is or shall be granted, is illegal;</li> <li>• That election of members of Parliament ought to be free;</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal.</li> <li>• They are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights.</li> <li>• Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed.</li> <li>• It is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it.</li> <li>• For imposing taxes on us without our consent.</li> <li>• For depriving us in many cases, of the benefits of Trial by Jury.</li> </ul>
